



## AREAS OF FUNDING This year we have had an increase in donations to specific areas of the school. With more students taking part in theater and sports, donations in these areas have increased.

## **\$1,000.00**

Sports teams donations were used to purchase equipment and trophies for flag football and basketball. Students entering Greenwood often lack self-confidence, and are frustrated or unmotivated due to past lack of success in school. They have difficulty communicating with their peers, developing and maintaining friendships, and resolving conflicts. In addition, the complex and pervasive nature of electronic communications and social media networking present significant issues for many individuals, linked in several recent studies to feelings of depression and isolation. Addressing these challenges directly with our students requires daily engagement, support, and guidance; and we try to provide as many opportunities as possible for outdoor learning and engagement. Greenwood School offers sports clubs at no additional cost to families. We encourage all students to take part in a club or extracurricular sports each semester.



## DONATIONS TO THEATER \$1,395.00

In March last year, the Greenwood School community put on our first full-scale, mainstage theater production: The Little Mermaid. With massive support from the 5&Dime Theater Company and guest lighting designer, Gabriel Barnet, the cast and crew were able to transform the Greenwood gymnasium into a beautiful stage. The production sold out every night and was a huge success. In October 2022, Greenwood officially chartered our first Thespian Troupe of the International Thespian Society: Troupe #10512. They competed at the District 2 Festival and 10 students attended the Thespian Festival in Tampa with lots of success: In our first year, Troupe 10512 earned 3 Excellents and 2 Superiors! A special thank you to Mr. Rivera, who has overseen both of these wonderful additions to Greenwood School. Watching our students express themselves through artistic means while growing in confidence has been a pleasure this year!





## DONATIONS TO THE READING PROGRAM \$300.00

Around 30% of Greenwood students have the primary exceptionality listed as dyslexia, although a great deal more are below grade level in reading and require support due to lack of accommodations elsewhere. Greenwood School uses the Rewards program in Middle School to support our students in reading, and to build their confidence in the subject. With the support of qualified teachers, our students find success in areas they once struggled in.

## ALL-STAR KIDS IN NATURE CLINIC \$550.00

Greenwood School has a special partnership with the Tesori Family Foundation, which was founded in 2009 by PGA Tour caddy Paul Tesori and his wife Michelle. The Foundation provides specific programming throughout the United States for children with special needs. Greenwood School students have the opportunity twice a year to support these children and teach them about our incredible wetlands. It has been an inspiring program, developing students' leadership skills while bringing joy to those in our local community.









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## GREENWOOD GRADUATES

Thirty-six students successfully graduated from Greenwood with their standard, traditionally tracked high school diploma in 2023.

Thirty two of those students went on to colleges and universities which include: Jacksonville University, University of Alabama, University of North Florida, University of Central Florida, Broward College, University of Florida, Savannah College of Art and Design, and Flight School at FSCJ. Other graduates enlisted in the military or enrolled in trade schools.

Greenwood School prepares students for college or career paths, and offers college and career fair opportunities, as well as college visits and regular guidance meetings with our guidance counselor to ensure students are confident in their chosen pathway. All students at Greenwood also complete guidance-based electives in college and career planning and adult transitions.



#### **SENIOR REFLECTIONS**

I've been here for the past 7 years and it has been a fun, challenging, and crazy ride. When I first started here in 6th grade I was nervous, shy, had no friends, didn't know anybody, and was very scared that people would make fun of me since I have high functioning autism. After the first 2 months here at Greenwood, I met new people and I wasn't afraid to embrace my autism anymore. I was very nervous about starting high school. I thought the work would be really hard because I struggled in middle school. To my surprise, the skills my middle school teachers taught me finally clicked. I was able to do the work, and I enjoyed the best 4 years of my life: prom, the Icemen hockey games, our senior breakfast, and the zoo trip. I would like to thank all my middle school and high school teachers but most of all, I would like to thank my mom and dad - thank you so much for letting me go to this amazing school.

#### GEORGE WALKER

The moment I stepped foot into the school for the first time, I knew Greenwood would be my second home. From the small classrooms to the gym, these types of classrooms were ideal for my social anxiety. My biggest accomplishments were me being voted as Student Council President for two years straight, as well as being a National Honor Society member. Throughout my time as President, those skills I learned there helped me with my public speaking and leadership to carry on into the real world. The National Honor Society mainly taught me to serve the community and practice humility. Remember students, it is not too late to get yourself out there in the school community and find ways to work harder than you ever have. That's how you win in life, and it starts right now.

#### CALEB PASTRANA

For me, Greenwood has been a huge help. I joined in my tenth grade year knowing almost no one and lacking social skills. I was nervous and didn't know what would happen. But the environment, teachers and students made it so easy for me to get comfortable and grow. I became very interested and was understanding what I was doing. I realized that I would like to work in Ithe scientific fieldl. I am very thankful for my time at Greenwood, and I will be using the things I learned and the friendships I made for the rest of my life.

#### MENACHEM GROSS

When I transferred here to Greenwood, the teachers understood my differences, they understood my high energy, and they taught in a way I could finally understand. Yet one thing was like a wall with ivy vines grown over it. A wall with thorns sharper than a fine sword to climb over. That was my will to learn. Due to my past schools, teachers, and peers, I still was afraid of learning and wanting to ask for help. Through Greenwood, I was able to cut back those ivy vines and thorns and climb over the wall. Every single one of my teachers here at Greenwood never allowed me to give up. I thank Greenwood for giving me the tools to hack away at the ivy and thorns and clearing a path for me to get over that wall. I have my will for learning back and so many memories have been made.


#### WILLIAM MCLAREN




# EVENT SPOTLIGHT: ANNUAL GALA TOTAL RAISED: \$20,760.00

#### **SPORTS TEAMS**



## BENTON FAMILY FOUNDATION GRANT

TO ENHANCE OUTDOOR EDUCATION

Greenwood School has been the recipient of the Benton Family Foundation grant for two years. In 2021-2022 the funds were used to build our outdoor education center in the wetlands, providing outdoor classroom space and a stage for students to utilize.

## LUCY GOODING CHARITABLE TRUST FOUNDATION GRANT

\$30,000.00

Greenwood School has been the recipient of the Lucy Gooding Charitable Trust Foundation grant for many years. The guidance counselor program at Greenwood is now entering its fourteenth year. Thanks to the funding of the Lucy Gooding Charitable Trust Foundation, Greenwood has been able to provide our students with guidance counseling services that are critical for success in school, and life beyond graduation. For 2022-2023, Greenwood has continued to expand the breadth and depth of the guidance programs, and integrate them more fully into the curriculum, while providing services of an on-site mental health counselor for students who need additional support.

## \$7,500.00

Thanks to generous grants from The Red Coats in 2021 and 2022, and matching funds from other donors, we built an ADA-accessible fitness center in the heart of our wetlands; this was completed in June 2022. The fitness center is used daily, and we have already seen an increase in focus and engagement, as well as strength and fitness in our students. The equipment is designed to improve students' balance and coordination, as well as their agility and core body strength. Equipment such as push-up bars, parallel bars, and overhead ladders now enable our students to build fitness, strength, confidence, problem-solving skills, and strategic planning skills, both individually and as a team.

## TESORI FAMILY FOUNDATION COMMUNITY GRANT \$5000.00

Greenwood received a generous grant from the Tesori Family Foundation in 2022 to improve the Environmental Education program. With the grant funds, we purchased greenhouses so that students can cultivate their own native plants, and built a large butterfly enclosure to ensure that our monarch butterfly waystation and migration research can successfully continue. We hope to continue providing education to groups outside of the Greenwood community to ensure that education about conservation continues throughout Northeast Florida. Exposure to gardens, further active interactions, and participation with nature provide mental and physiological advantages that improve healing and therapy.
